BRC-1 MINUTES

RESOLVED – that the minutes of the meeting held on 29 April 2014 be confirmed and signed by the Chair.

BRC-4 COMMUNITY GOVERNANCE REVIEW – HADLEY & LEEGOMERY PARISH WARDING : FINAL RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee received the report of the Assistant Director: Law, Democracy & People Services that contained the proposed final recommendations following a review of ward boundaries in Hadley and Leegomery Parish.

At its last meeting, the Committee agreed to commence a Community Governance Review following a request from Hadley & Leegomery Parish Council to correct an error that had arisen in the boundary between Hadley Castle and Leegomery wards by restoring the boundaries agreed following the last review of warding arrangements in the Parish in 2009. Unfortunately, this anomaly had been incorporated into the recent Electoral Review for Telford & Wrekin by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE). Following the publication of the Terms of Reference and Draft Proposals documents for public consultation, one submission had been received from Hadley & Leegomery Parish Council, a copy of which was appended to the report. This reiterated the Parish Council's desire to see the ward boundary corrected in time for the 2015 elections.

The Final Proposals document attached to the report concurred with the request and submission, and recommended that the most appropriate ward boundary between Hadley Castle and Leegomery wards be that shown on the attached Map 2. This

reflected the boundaries agreed at the 2009/10 Community Governance Review of the Parish, and would see approximately 430 electors in Hadley being returned to the Hadley Castle Parish ward. If the final recommendations were adopted, the Council would then publish a Reorganisation of Community Governance Order, effective for the 7 May 2015 Parish elections, and formally request the LGBCE to make a Related Alterations Order.

The Democratic Services Manager reported that the Order to give effect to the LGBCE's final recommendations following its recent Review of Electoral Arrangements in the Borough of Telford & Wrekin had been delayed and had not yet been laid before Parliament. Until these parliamentary approvals had been obtained, the Council would not be able to progress the necessary legal and administrative processes to implement the final recommendations of this Community Governance Review. It was therefore suggested that recommendation 2.2 in the report be amended to reflect this situation.

Members were supportive of the final proposals, given that this had been requested by the Parish Council in order to correct an anomaly in the ward boundary, and that there were no objections.

RESOLVED –

- (a) that the Final Recommendations , as shown in the document attached to the report and at Map 2, be adopted and published;**
- (b) that, subject to the necessary parliamentary approvals being passed, a Reorganisation of Community Governance Order be published by the Council, effective for the 7 May 2015 Parish elections, and that then a formal request be made to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England to make a Related Alterations Order.**

BRC-5 COMMUNITY GOVERNANCE REVIEW – LILLESHALL, DONNINGTON & MUXTON PARISH : FINAL RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee received the report of the Assistant Director: Law, Democracy & People Services, appended to which was the suggested Final Proposals in response to the petition for a Community Governance Review (CGR). The CGR had been triggered following the submission of a valid petition calling for a separate parish to be formed for the Lilleshall ward of Lilleshall, Donnington & Muxton Parish Council.

The Draft Proposals agreed by the Committee, and published in February 2014, recognised that Lilleshall appeared to fulfil the technical and legal requirements to form a separate Parish. However, in order to assist in making a final recommendation, it was agreed to hold a ballot of Lilleshall electors to determine their views on a separate Parish. The result, based on a 53% turnout, was 320 in favour of a separate Lilleshall Parish and 259 against. Subsequently, a counter petition opposing any change in parish arrangements was received, signed by 553 electors. A copy of the petition was attached to the report along with the submissions received following the publication of the draft proposals.

The Final Recommendations were for the creation of a separate Lilleshall Parish Council returning 7 Parish Councillors. This was a finely balanced recommendation, based on the fact that Lilleshall fulfilled the tests required for the formation of a separate Parish, together with the consultation responses received since the Review commenced. A number of responses had been received opposing change together with a substantial counter petition. However, greater weight had been attributed to the result of the poll of electors, which had given the community an opportunity to express their views in a secret ballot carried out under election rules.

During the ensuing debate, Members acknowledged that this had been a difficult Review with strongly held views in the community both for and against the proposal for a separate Parish Council. During both this and the earlier CGR, a number of petitions had been submitted on both sides, but these often overlapped in terms of signatories and had provided no clear guidance as to the views of the broader Lilleshall community. The Committee were in agreement that the result of the secret ballot of all Lilleshall electors, based on a good turnout, was the most accurate gauge of local opinion and that this did give the proposal for a separate Parish a democratic mandate. In response to questions about the processes that would need to be followed to establish a new Parish in time for the May 2015 elections, the Assistant Director advised that there would be a transition process during which some form of steering group or 'shadow' council would be needed to work on the setting of a budget and Council Tax precept for Lilleshall prior to the elections. Members accepted that, based on the advice of the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, seven councillors was the appropriate democratic representation for the new Parish Council.

RESOLVED - that the Final Recommendations, as shown in the document attached to the report, be adopted and published.

4. **SUMMARY**

The amended Representation of the People Act 1983 requires the Council to conduct a review of the polling districts into which our parliamentary constituencies are divided. The Act also requires the Council to review its polling places and polling stations. This report asks the Committee to agree that the Electoral Services Manager can initiate the review.

6. **INFORMATION**

6.1 **Background**

The procedure for a review of polling districts, polling places and polling stations is laid down in the Representation of the People Act.

The Council initiated the review by publishing a Notice of Start of Review. The Council then published the proposals made by the Returning Officer for alterations. Comments were invited during a consultation period. At the end of this consultation, the Council considers the comments received and adopts an arrangement of polling districts and polling places for a period of four years, after which there is a further duty to review.

The review process has been outlined in paragraphs 5.1-2 above and in greater detail in the Background Information and the Returning Officer's Recommendations document appended to this report.

There are a number of changes to the original proposals

- Polling District WAC (Apley Castle) will continue to vote at the nearby Leegomery Community Centre.
- Polling District TDA has been split, forming a new Polling District TDP, allowing electors to vote more conveniently at Dawley Christian Centre.
- TDZ electors will now vote at Southall School (Dawley & Aqueduct -Langley South) rather than using the portacabin at Beechwood Road.
- THC electors (Lightmoor) will now vote at the Oak Tree Centre which is closer to where they live. THL electors (Lawley) will now vote at Lawley & Overdale Parish council offices rather than Lawley Community Centre.
- Voters from Polling District TIH (Ironbridge Gorge – Hilltop) and TMD (Madeley & Sutton Hill – Hilltop) will vote together at Woodlands Primary School. The existing station at Abraham Darby is very small and the Returning Officer is of the view that it would be more clear and convenient to send electors in these areas to the same polling station in order to avoid confusion.
- Electors in Polling District TLE currently vote at Dawley Baptist Church, the recommendations are for them to vote at this venue or at the TA Centre Cavan Drive. The Returning Officer is currently awaiting a response on the latter venue.
- WMH electors (Humbers) previously voted at Turreff Hall, Donnington. The recommendations are that they should vote at this venue or at Muxton Community Centre. However, the Returning Officer has some concerns over space available at the latter venue as it is already a double polling station.

6.2 Equality and Diversity

The Act requires that, so far as is reasonable and practicable, every polling place should be accessible to electors who are disabled. The Act states that the Authority must have regard to the accessibility to disabled persons of potential polling stations.

1 Guidelines

The Returning Officer and the Council adopted the following policies in this Review.

Returning Officer's recommendations

– Page 1

- any proposals for the creation of new polling districts must identify a publicly available building within the proposed polling district for use as a polling station unless the size or other circumstances of a polling district are such that the situation of the polling stations does not materially affect the convenience of electors.
- The Polling place must be an area in the Polling district unless special circumstances make it desirable to designate an area wholly or partly outside the district (for example if no accessible place can be identified in the district).
- the electors of different electoral areas (parliamentary constituencies at parliamentary elections or borough or parish wards at local elections) should not in normal circumstances vote together at the same polling station unless this can not be avoided
- polling district boundaries should not cross existing parish, parish ward or borough ward boundaries and polling districts should be wholly contained within an existing parish, parish ward or borough ward;
- ideally there should be no more than 2,500 polling station voters allocated to a polling station, and the high numbers of postal voters in the borough (presently about 36,000) together with the use of 'dual polling stations' in the same building should be used to ensure that this target is met;
- there is a general presumption against the use of portable buildings as polling stations unless there are no other alternatives, not least, because of the additional costs to the public purse that arise from the hire, setting up and equipping of a portable building;
- schools are not always available for use as polling stations, and there is a preference against the closure of schools unless no other options are available;
- The following requirements are laid down in the Representation of the People Act 1983, and they are also adopted by the Returning Officer and the Council as key policies:

- the council will seek to ensure that all electors have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances;
- the council will seek to ensure that, so far as is reasonable and practicable, every polling place is accessible to electors who are disabled;
- every parish shall be in a separate polling district;
- ideally the polling place should be in its own polling district.

2. The Returning Officer's Recommendations

2.1 Introduction

The pattern of polling districts and polling places in the Borough of Telford and Wrekin has evolved to meet successive boundary changes to borough and parish wards and to meet the convenience of electors across the borough. It ensures that electors have reasonable facilities for voting. Furthermore, in line with the Council's policies, every attempt has been made to ensure that polling stations are accessible to electors who are disabled. Following the Borough Boundary Review a number of changes are required in order to ensure reasonable voting facilities for those electors affected by the review and associated Parish warding arrangements. The Review reduced the number of Borough wards from the current 34 to 30 for elections from 7 May 2015. A number of current wards have been renamed or merged under the new boundary arrangements. A table of recommendations published at the conclusion of the Review by LGBCE is shown below for the 30 Borough wards which will be represented by 54 councillors. Where the boundaries for different elections are no longer co-terminous separate polling districts will need to be created. From 7 May 2015 the Borough will contain 27 Parishes and two non-parished areas which are made up of 90 Polling Districts. These areas are then broken up into polling districts. A number of Polling Districts will be renamed and given different three letter references in order to ensure that the electoral register remains in order by Polling District and Borough ward. Where the Review has created a new Parish ward a new polling district will need to be created for electors in that Parish ward. Following a Community Governance Review, Lilleshall will become a separate Parish for the elections in May, leaving a residual Donnington & Muxton Parish. There are two Parliamentary constituencies, Telford Borough and The Wrekin County constituencies.

Maps of Borough Wards with Polling Districts and Polling Stations are attached together with a key showing Polling Station numbers as shown on maps. A spreadsheet is also attached which shows each Polling District with electorates, Parliamentary constituency, Borough ward, Parish and Parish ward and proposed Polling Station.

2.2 Guidelines

The Returning Officer and the Council have adopted the following policies in this Review.

- any proposals for the creation of new polling districts must identify a publicly available building within the proposed polling district for use as a polling station unless the size or other circumstances of a polling district are such that the situation of the polling stations does not materially affect the convenience of electors.
- The Polling place must be an area in the Polling district unless special circumstances make it desirable to designate an area wholly or partly outside the district (for example if no accessible place can be identified in the district).
- the electors of different electoral areas (parliamentary constituencies at parliamentary elections or borough or parish wards at local elections) should not in normal circumstances vote together at the same polling station unless this can not be avoided

2.3 The Tables

Following a summary of the proposed changes, each borough ward is dealt with separately. The tables show the existing polling arrangements in each borough ward:

the polling district identity letters
 the polling place for the district
 the polling station at that place
 the number of electors on 1 December 2014 including attainers 'rising 18'
 disabled access, including where this is achieved by the use of a temporary ramp.

A set of ward maps showing the present polling districts follows the tables.

2.4 Glossary of terms

Borough wards – The division of the borough into areas for the purposes of electing councillors to represent its different parts. The Borough of Telford and Wrekin is divided into 30 borough wards, but the wards are not the subject of this review.

Boundary reviews – the reviews of the boundaries of parishes, boroughs or parliamentary constituencies. Boundary reviews are not part of this review.

Electoral arrangements – the allocation of councillors to a council and the division of a parish or borough into wards with the allocation of councillors to wards. The electoral arrangements of the parishes and of the borough are not the subject of this review.

Parish wards – The division of a parish into areas for the purposes of electing councillors to represent the different parts of the same parish. The parish of Wellington is divided into seven parish wards; the parish of Hollinswood and Randlay is an unwarded parish. The parish wards are not the subject of this review.

Returning Officer's recommendations

Polling arrangements – the provision of reasonable and convenient facilities for the electors to cast their votes by the division of a constituency into polling districts with polling places and polling stations

Polling district – an area in the constituency for which the electors vote together at the same polling place. The polling district is defined by the Council.

Polling district letters – three letters that distinguish the polling district and that, together with the elector's number from the register of electors for that district, make up the elector's distinctive and unique electoral registration number. The polling districts in the Telford Borough Constituency have polling district letters beginning with T, while those in The Wrekin County Constituency begin with W.

Polling place – a readily identifiable place within the polling district to which the electors will go to vote. The polling place is defined by the Council.

Polling station – the building or part of a building at the polling place which will serve as the venue for the poll; the extent of the polling station will depend upon local circumstances. The polling station is chosen by the Returning Officer.

Following the Borough Boundary review a number of electors were transferred between Apley Castle and Hadley & Leegomery wards. These electors will vote in the Apley Castle ward of Hadley & Leegomery Parish. The Berberis Drive area has moved in to

the ward whilst the Lawton Farm Way area has moved to Hadley & Leegomery. Redrawing of the Borough boundary means that the current polling station is no longer in Apley Castle ward but is now in Hadley & Leegomery ward.

There were two possible options

- Voters to continue to vote at Leegomery Community Centre but outside of their Borough ward using dual polling station . This would lead to Apley Castle and Hadley & Leegomery borough electors voting at the same polling station for Parliamentary, Borough and Parish elections.
- Returning Officer to look at availability of Apley school as polling station for Apley Castle electors. If this option was taken then it would be likely to lead to the closure of the school on the day of election.

The Returning Officer recommends that for this election arrangements remain unchanged and that Apley Castle electors continue to vote at Leegomery Community Centre

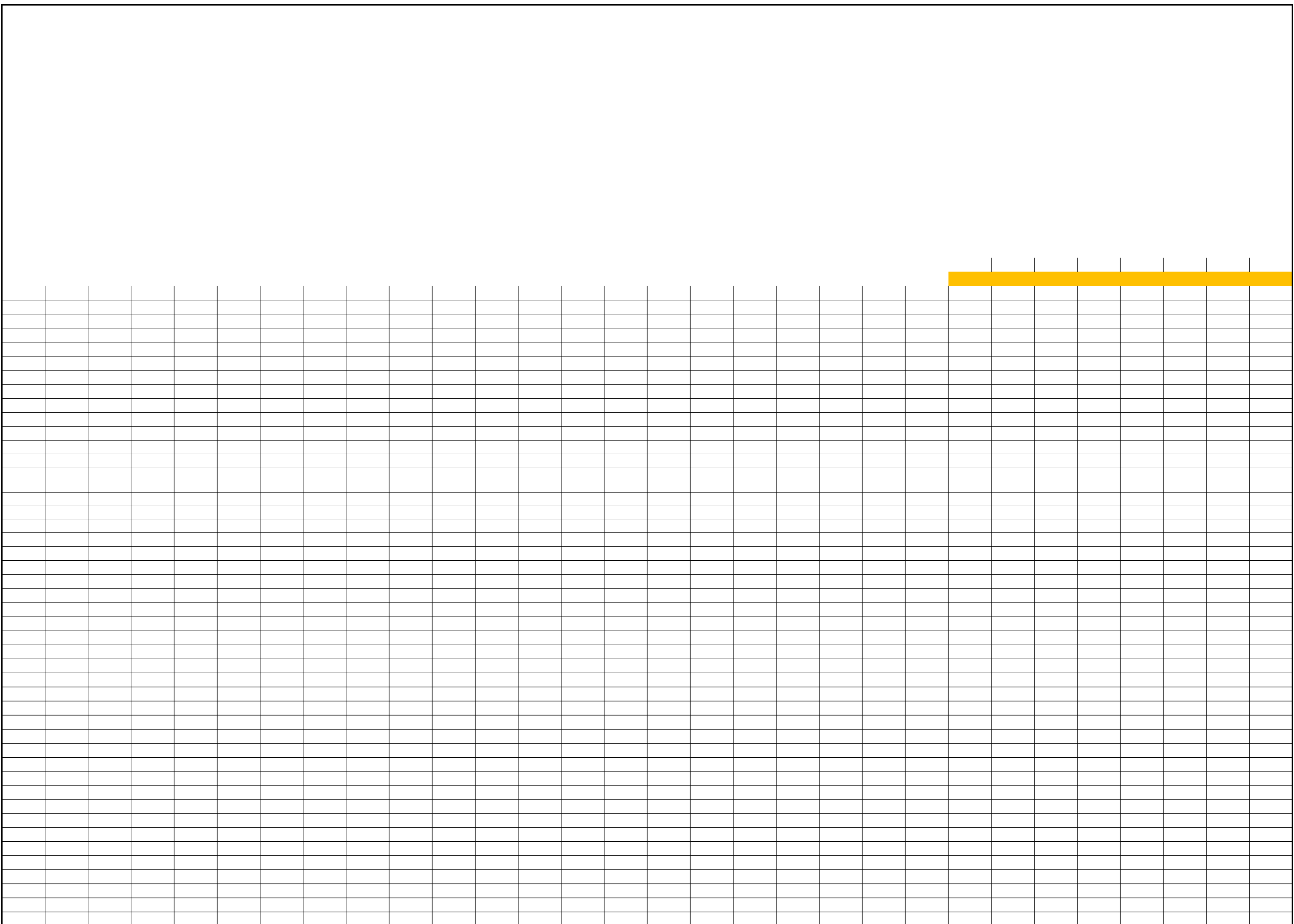
